"invited" Angles, Saxons, and Jutes to join his military power, so the land saw a swell of invasions by Jutes -- a germanic tribe from Denmark -- in 449, followed soon by Angles and Saxons (The current name originates as "Angle-Land") These hordes settled in and pushed the Celts into Cornwall, Wales, Ireland, and to the north

Anglo-Saxon England His job was to protect his people from attack and make laws King Slaves made up about 10% of the population, and were viewed more as property than people Owning slaves was a normal part of life for the Anglo-Saxons, but the Normans thought it was cruel Slaves Peasants and merchants could work their way up to thegn status
