EARLY MEDIEVAL HEDINGHAM WARE (Late 12 th - 14 th Century AD) Fine orange or red fabric and a sparkly appearance to the surface due to there being large quantities of mica, a glassy mineral, in the clay Usually made into glazed pots LATE MEDIEVAL TUDOR GREEN WARE (1380 - 1600AD) Very fine, thin white pottery with a bright green glaze
