Ended the Anglo-Saxon Period in 1066 AD with the Norman Conquest Led by William the Conqueror, who claimed the old Anglo-Saxon king, Edward the Confessor, had promised him the throne Introduced the French language and culture Began linguistic changes resulting in Middle English

Anglo-Saxon hero is that those factors which go to make up the Heroic Age of the Anglo-Saxon tribes—that childhood period through which all peoples seem to pass, in which hero-worship is the underlying psychological motif<sup>2</sup>—obtained while the Anglo-Saxons were still on the Continent rather than after their migration to the British Isles
